Time Commitment

Training

The Camp Director will help to create a plan for first aid. Training for medical situations should be previous to this week of camp.

Responsibilities

As the first aid provider you are charged with making sure any medical situation that arises at camp is taken care of. A cut or bruise all the way through accidents that need major medical attention.

1. Observing facilities and making sure kids will be safe while being active at camp.
2. Create a medical emergency plan if a camper or volunteer need to get to a hospital.
3. Work alongside the snack coordinator regarding allergies in foods.
4. Working with the security coordinator to look for outside issues that may arise.
5. Making and maintaining a medical first aid kit for all kinds of medical needs.
6. Having a way to notify authorities if a major medical emergency does occur.
7. Communicating the first aid plan to all assistant coaches and UW Sports Ministry staff.
